ADMISSION PROCEDURES

1. Fill out Application for Admission and return to Boise State's Twin Falls Program Coordinator
2. Have colleges and universities that you have attended previously send official transcripts to: Boise State University Coordinator, College of Southern Idaho Campus, P.O. Box 1238, Twin Falls, ID 83303-1238
3. The \$40 undergraduate application fee will be waived for applicants in the Twin Falls program.

REGISTRATION

Register online at brncoweb.boisestate.edu from any internet-connected computer by using your user name and password. You may also register in the Twin Falls office, Taylor Administration Building Room 202, CSI, 8 am to 5 pm, Mon-Fri.

FEE AND STUDENT STATUS INFORMATION

IMPORTANT CHANGE TO FULL-TIME STUDENT STATUS:

Beginning Fall 2009, a full-time undergraduate student at Boise State University will be defined, for fee paying purposes, as a student enrolled in 12 or more credits and 9 or more credits for graduate students. Currently, students taking 8 or more credits are defined as full-time for tuition and fee paying purposes.

NON-DEGREE SEEKING STUDENTS: Please note that non-degree seeking students will still be limited to any combination of courses totaling seven or fewer credits; or a maximum of two courses, even if these courses total more than seven credits.

Fee payment deadline for Fall 2009 is Thursday, August 20.

IMPORTANT FEE POLICY

Once you register for classes/workshops, you remain registered and are held responsible for the fees and grades assessed for these classes unless you cancel your registration. *If you do not pay for or do not attend these classes, you are still held responsible for the fees and grades assessed.* If you decide not to attend any classes, you must drop all of them (including classes and workshops that begin later in the semester) by going through BroncoWeb at brncoweb.boisestate.edu **no later than Thursday, August 20.** If you do not cancel your registration or pay your fees by the fee payment deadline, you will remain registered, you will be charged course fees, and you will be assessed a \$50 late penalty.

REFUND POLICY

Students enrolled in undergraduate courses and MSW courses that meet in the regular semester session can withdraw without a W and receive a full refund (less a \$25 processing fee) on or before Sept. 4. **NOTE:** Students in the Bilingual masters classes can add/drop without a W and receive a refund through the first scheduled day of class. 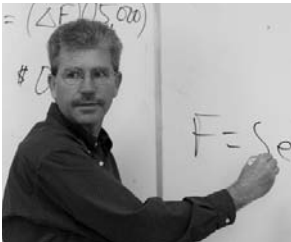
