Admission to the College of Business and Economics (COBE)

Starting in Spring 2012, students interested in pursuing a degree in the COBE (except for B.A. in Economics and B.A. in Economics, Social Studies, Secondary Education Emphasis) must be admitted to the College. Admission to COBE is required before a student may enroll in upper division business and economics courses, with the exception of seven “open” courses. Admission to COBE is competitive and based on various academic criteria such as overall GPA, performance in gateway courses, and other business and economics courses. Meeting the criteria does not guarantee admission.
