
LIMIT ON THE NUMBER OF "W'S"

PURPOSE: To establish policy to limit the number of withdrawals (W's) a student may accrue toward his or her academic program.

I. Policy Statement

Students may accrue up to ten (10) withdrawals (W's) for a baccalaureate degree. They may accrue up to five (5) for an associate degree, technical certificate, or advanced technical certificate program. Any "W's" received in an associate degree program, technical or advanced technical certificate program count toward the 10 allowed for the baccalaureate degree program.

Withdrawals from corequisite courses (lecture/lab) will count as one "W." Any withdrawal grade (W) given as a result of a complete withdrawal will not count toward the ten total allowed.

Once a student has exhausted the number of "W's" allowed, the student may receive only a grade of A, B, C, D, P or F in any succeeding course.

Once a student has earned a baccalaureate degree, they may earn an additional ten toward a second baccalaureate degree or an additional five toward an additional associate degree.

III. Procedures

This policy applies only to courses in which "W's" are received in the Fall Semester 1995 or after. Any "W's" earned prior to that semester will not be counted toward the number allowed.

Students will receive notification of the number of "W's" they have used and how many they have left each semester.
