Department of Special Services. I was responsible for developing and organizing several separate training sessions through the State of Idaho that trained the disadvantaged in how to participate in comprehensive health planning. Project culminated in a joint Boise State University-Department of Health conference on “The Health Needs of Low Income Consumers” which took place in the fall of 1971.

- 1969 – 1970 Chief Social Worker for the Idaho Department of Health. Duties include supervising other social workers and ultimate responsibility for all the cases in Ada County.
- 1966 - 1969 Staff member for the Kansas Commission on Civil Rights. Primary duties included organizing local NAACP chapters throughout Kansas and writing tentative legislation for consideration by the Kansas Legislature. Served as a consultant for the same organization in the area of developing affirmative action programs for several state agencies and businesses.
- 1965 – 1966 Program Director for the Shawnee County Detention Home in Topeka, Kansas. Duties included the supervision of seven other staff members and carrying out individual treatment plans for teenagers placed in the home.
- 1962 – 1965 Psychiatric aide at Topeka State Hospital. During last two years, charge aide for adolescent treatment ward. Duties included supervision of three other staff members; responsible for approximately 30 patients assigned to the ward.
