STUDENT UNION BUILDING (SUB)

Begin your Self-Guided Tour at one of the most vibrant and frequently used spaces at Boise State. The Student Union Building is the main hub for student life - from student organizations to dining and activities including:

- The Bronco Shop make sure to stock up on your blue and orange gear!
- Buster's Kitchen, our main cafeteria on campus!

The Student Union Building is the ideal starting point for your visit, offering a glimpse into the lively community and resources available to students.




² REC CENTER

Just across the street from the Student Union Building, you'll find our award-winning, 105,000-square-foot Student Recreation Center. Full-time students have free access to all of the facilities. This building features exercise and weight rooms, racquetball courts, 3 basketball courts, an indoor running track, an aquatics center, a rock climbing wall, and our Outdoor Program offices.



ON CAMPUS HOUSING

The First-Year Village is a bustling area on campus where you'll find the majority of our first-year residence halls. First-year students have the opportunity to live on-campus in suite or communal style residence halls, have support from our Resident Assistants and Residential Directors, free laundry, and tons of ways to build community.



ALBERTSONS STADIUM

Famous for its iconic blue turf, Albertsons Stadium is the proud home of our Boise State Football Team. Make sure to stop by the Allen Noble Hall of Fame where you can explore the rich history of the Broncos and to snap a photo in front of the legendary Blue Field. Did you know? Boise State University holds a patent on all non-green colored fields!



5 ALBERTSONS LIBRARY

Spend a few minutes exploring Albertsons Library! Inside, you'll find numerous study rooms, cozy "cocoon" chairs, and stunning views of the Boise River. As a student, you can access an extensive amount of resources beyond books - our podcasting studio, vinyl record room, 3-D printers, study spaces, and more! Our students take full advantage of being able to study while having spectacular views of the Boise skyline and river.



THE QUAD

The Quad is the heart of our campus, both geographically and socially. This area is surrounded by key buildings, one of which includes the Administration Building, home to the office of the University President, the Financial Aid and Scholarships Department, and the Office of the Registrar. The Quad is one of the best places to find involvement opportunities as many of our 200+ Student Clubs and 24+ Greek Chapters will be out enjoying the sunshine and sharing info about their upcoming events.



CENTER FOR VISUAL ARTS

Home to the Department of Art, Design, and Visual Studies, this building is a true masterpiece. Inside, you can find the Stein Luminary, student showcase spaces, and breathtaking views of Downtown Boise. This stunning facility is a must-see for art enthusiasts and visitors alike! Make sure to check out the steel statue named Fledgling Flight, which represents our school's growth from Boise State College to Boise State University.



FRIENDSHIP BRIDGE

Friendship Bridge symbolizes the friendship between Boise State and the city of Boise and is located on the Boise River Greenbelt, a 25 mile stretch of scenic riverside trail. Getting downtown is a quick and easy 15-minute walk. Make sure to enjoy all that downtown Boise has to offer - music venues, coffee shops, festivals, restaurants, boutiques and more! Boise State students can easily get around the local area by foot, bike, and scooters, as well as with our Bronco Shuttle system.



MICRON BUSINESS AND ECONOMICS BUILDING

Home to our College of Business and Economics, this building contains interactive classrooms, inviting study spaces, a professional clothing closet, a coffee shop, and a cozy lobby perfect for some downtime before class. It's also where you'll find the Skaggs Hall of Learning, our largest lecture hall on campus. Boise State offers tons of academic support for students of all majors - teaching assistants, free tutoring labs, and guaranteed office hours.



INTERACTIVE LEARNING CENTER (ILC)

Explore the Interactive Learning Center to catch a glimpse of Boise State's academic environment. This building features private study rooms, classrooms, and lecture halls. Additionally, you'll find a variety of dining options here and "The Zone" which is our technical support office for students. Students are able to check out equipment such as laptops, GoPros, and iPads from The Zone for free.



B PLAZA

All visitors have to take a memorable photo at the iconic B-Plaza. This popular landmark is where new students often take their first pictures as Broncos and return for their graduation photos. It's a symbol of the Boise State journey, marking both the beginning of your time here and the celebration of your accomplishments.

TRANSPORTATION

Everything in Boise is so close that you may not even need a rental car. Walk the short 10 minutes into the heart of downtown or rent a bike at our Cycle Learning Center for the day. Located in the Lincoln Parking Garage, the CLC is focused on developing healthy and sustainable lifestyles.

Places to See in Boise

- Idaho State Capitol Building: Visit this architectural gem located in the heart of downtown Boise. It's a centerpiece of Idaho's government and history!
- **Hyde Park:** Stroll through Boise's Historic District and enjoy a charming neighborhood known for its cozy coffee shops and sweet treats.
- Table Rock: Hike up to Table Rock for breathtaking panoramic views of Downtown Boise, the Boise State campus, and the picturesque foothills.

Seasonal Activities

- quintessential Boise summer experience by floating down the Boise River. Catch the shuttle from Ann Morrison Park to Barber Park, where you can rent tubes, kayaks, or rafts. From there, enjoy a scenic float back to Ann Morrison Park, drifting through the heart of campus along the way.
- Bogus Basin Mountain Resort: Situated just 16 miles to the north, Bogus offers 2,600 acres for Nordic and downhill skiing, as well as snowboarding. The excitement doesn't end when the snow melts; summer activities include Idaho's only mountain coaster, miles of world-class mountain biking trails, and a variety of other adventures.
