Who is eligible to vote?

- To vote in the state of Idaho, you must be all of these things:
 - A U.S. citizen
 - A resident of Idaho and in the county for 30 days prior to Election Day
 - At least 18 years old before or on Election Day
 - Not convicted of a felony. If you have been convicted, you must have completed all sentencing conditions including probation and parole.

Registering to vote with the voter card:

Provide your Idaho driver's license or state I.D. number on the form. If you do not have a driver's license or state I.D., you can list the last four digits of your Social Security Number.

You may mail or deliver your completed card to your county.

If mailed, the card must be postmarked by the 25th day before an election.

What if I don't have a driver's license or identification card issued by the Idaho Department of Motor Vehicles?

- You may use the last four (4) digits of your social security number
 OR the following forms of photo I.D. are accepted.
- a tribal identification card
- a U.S. passport
- a current student I.D. card



What you need to know about mail in registration If you are a first-time voter in Idaho, a copy of current and valid

- If you are a first-time voter in Idaho, a copy of current and valid photo identification OR a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check or other government document that shows your name and address should be submitted.
- Mail-in registration forms must be received by your County Clerk no later than October 9, 2020 by 5 p.m.



Will there be Election Day voter registration?

- Yes. You can still register up until and on Election Day.
- You can register to vote at:
 - Early voting poll location
 - Polling location day of elections



Party Affiliation

All voters in the general election in November receive the same ballot for their location.



How to Request an Absentee Ballot

- You can request an absentee ballot on the Idaho Votes website.
 - Request an absentee ballot online
- Or, download an absentee ballot from the Secretary of State's website and mail your completed absentee ballot request to your County Clerk's office.





When do Absentee ballots need to be requested?

- To receive a ballot for the Nov. 3 election, you request must be received by October 23, 2020 by 5:00 pm in the county you are voting in.
- For your vote to be counted, your filled out ballot must be returned to your local County Clerk/elections office by November 3, 2020 at 8:00 pm (local time zone).
- Recommendations:
 - Recommend for people to request before deadline
 - Make sure their signature is on the absentee ballot
 - Contact <u>county clerk</u> for locations for absentee ballot drop boxes

How do I check the status of my ballot?

You can check the status of your absentee ballot on the Idaho Votes website (note: it may take 10-14 days from receipt to process and return your absentee ballot to you by mail).

Will there be a pre-paid stamp to send out my voter registration card and absentee ballot?

- Many counties are paying postage for absentee ballots. If your county is not paying postage, you can visit your local grocery store to get postage for your absentee ballot—free of charge—so you can then mail your absentee ballot to your County Clerk.
- Voter registration cards will not have pre-paid postage.



Early Day Voting

- Early voting locations are based by county and close on Oct. 30.
- Contact your <u>local election office</u> for information on early voting availability.
- What to bring
 - You will be asked to show photo ID to vote in Idaho.
 - Voters without ID: If you are unable to provide ID, you will be given the option of signing the Personal Identification Affidavit in order to cast a ballot.



Election Day

- Polls will also be open on election day for in-person voting but locations may have changed due to COVID-19 restrictions. Check with your county clerk for the most up to date information.
- Polling location will be open from 8:00 AM- 8:00 PM



Registering to Vote in Person

- In Idaho, you can register to vote at the polls on Election Day!
 - 1. Complete a voter registration card
 - 2. Provide proof of residency that contains a valid address that matches the address used on your voter registration card
 - 3. Provide an approved form of photo identification
- Documents accepted to prove residency include:
 - Idaho driver's license or an Idaho identification card
 - Any document which contains a valid address in the county together with a photo identification



IMPORTANT DATES

- October 9, 2020 last day to register
- October 23, 2020 last day to request an absentee ballot
- October 30, 2020 last day for early voting ends at 5 p.m.
- November 3, 2020 General Election. Polls open 8 a.m. 8 p.m. If registered to vote before Election Day, bring your photo ID. You can sign the Personal Identification Affidavit if you do not have an Idaho ID.
