## **Eligibility:**

A Pell-eligible student whose parent or guardian died in the line of duty while performing as a public safety officer is eligible to receive a maximum Pell Grant for the award year, if determined eligible.

To qualify, a student must be Pell-eligible, and be less than 24 years of age or enrolled at an institution of higher education at the time of their parent's or guardian's death. In future award years, the student continues to be eligible, as long as they have a Pell-eligible EFC and continues to be an eligible student.

A public safety officer is defined as:

- The definition used in section 1204 of title I of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. 3796b) or
- A fire police officer who is serving in accordance with State or local law as an officially recognized or designated member of a legally organized public safety agency and provides scene security or directs traffic in response to any fire drill, fire call, or other fire, rescue, or police emergency, or at a planned special event.
