Scholars Stipend Program

What the program has to offer:

- Learn “Family Centered Practice Principles”
- Foster Care and Adoption focus with trainings and services
- Potential employment opportunities with the Idaho Department of Children and Family Services or Native Tribes upon graduation
- Practicum placements in Idaho

The Stipend

- Provides financial assistance for bachelors and masters level social work students who are committed to child welfare
- The stipend is \$6,800 a year for BSW students and \$8,000 a year for MSW students to use towards fees and books.
- Recipients must agree to accept employment in the Idaho Division of Child and Family Services within the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare (IDHW) or Native Tribes for a time period that corresponds with the stipend received (i.e. 1 year stipend = 1 year working)

- Develop advanced skills in Child Welfare Practice
- Attend interactive seminars with other students
- Work directly with children and families in the Foster Care System

Master Skills In:

- Assessment
- Case Management
- Case Planning
- Crisis Intervention
- Documentation

Upon Graduation

- Become a licensed social worker in Idaho
- Consultation with IDHW recruiter to learn of availability for employment
- Submit application for employment with FACS or Native Tribes
