As a team, we've become adept at working remotely and have found ways to connect through our virtual Thoughtful Thursday social gatherings and team-wide chess tournaments. We've welcomed two new full-time, year-round staff, McAllister Hall and Dr. Cheong Kim. We've also wished founding director Greg Hill good luck as he moves to South Korea for his new position with the University of Utah. Now as we move into this new phase of IPI the team is embarking upon an ambitious strategic planning initiative. With the help of Holly Mikesell from the Provost's Office, we've taken the first step in this process and identified several goals for IPI including stabilizing our revenue model, diversifying the dissemination of our research, strengthening our relationships with our colleagues at Boise State, and providing actionable research opportunities for students. VANESSA FRY NAMED INTERIM DIRECTOR

IPI is pleased to announce that research director Vanessa Fry will serve as interim director of the institute following the <u>departure of Greg Hill</u>. Hill has accepted a new role as chief administrative officer and dean of faculty at the University of Utah's Asia campus in Incheon, South Korea.

"IPI's founding director, Dr. Greg Hill, has helped build the foundation for an impactful and resilient institute. I'm looking forward to working with the IPI team to continue scaling our work across Idaho and beyond," Fry said.

Effective this summer, Fry has also taken over the instruction of the Master of Public Administration capstone course. This fall, she will co-launch a Vertically Integrated Project (VIP) to allow students to engage in research to address housing issues in the Treasure Valley.



In 2016, Fry co-founded the Idaho Policy Institute with Greg Hill. Since then, Fry has led projects focusing on a number of issues including education, workforce development, transportation, and housing and homelessness. Her scholarship has been influential throughout the state and beyond.

Throughout her education and professional career, Fry has focused on utilizing multi-sector, evidencedbased solutions to address persistent social, environmental and economic issues. Prior to joining Boise State, Fry collaborated with a number of non-profit organizations; she was the co-founder and former chair of what is now Sun Valley Economic Development, a public-private partnership. She has taught as adjunct faculty at Presidio Graduate School for more than 10 years and also serves on the board of directors of the American Red Cross of Greater Idaho, where she assists with strategic planning and fundraising.

Institute faculty and staff look forward to continued growth under Fry's innovative and reliable leadership. The depth and breadth of Fry's experience, along with her work as the research director of the institute, embody IPI's core principles of collaboration, community responsiveness, educational impact, public engagement and research integrity.

Fry is an alumna of Boise State University, where she earned her doctorate in Public Policy and Administration from the School of Public Service. She also holds a MBA from Presidio Graduate School and a bachelor's degree in biology and fine art from Wittenberg University.

Outside of her work at Boise State, she can often be found running, floating rivers, skiing and exploring Idaho with her husband, two daughters and puppy. PROJECT UPDATE

IDAHO PUBLIC TELEVISION ATTITUDINAL AWARENESS SURVEY

Idaho Public Television (IPTV) has partnered with the Idaho Policy Institute to facilitate a deeper understanding of how its programming is perceived by the general public, state officials, and its constituents (i.e. donors, viewers, etc.). IPI will gather qualitative data through a survey on perceptions of IPTV's organization and programming, including the program *Idaho Reports*. It's finding will be presented to IPTV in late August.

MASTER OF ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT WORKFORCE ANALYSIS

A group of interdisciplinary faculty at Boise State University has partnered with Idaho Policy Institute to conduct a needs assessment of a proposed Master of Environmental Management (MEM) degree at Boise State. The assessment will include both a comparative and market analysis. The basis of that assessment will be to inform the creation of a MEM degree. The team is currently researching higher education market trends and reviewing similar degree programs in the region and across the country. The next project phase will be interviews with MEM program directors.

MONTH IN REVIEW

CONVALESCENT PLASMA DONATION

Vanessa Fry has been mentioned in several local articles pertaining to her recent convalescent plasma donation. In the articles "<u>Shining a light: A plasma donor, another mask maker and a rock painting family</u>," and "<u>American Red Cross asking for convalescent plasma donations</u>," Fry talks about her motivation for donating plasma after recovering from COVID-19. "To be able to give back after that is really good because I know so many people are suffering from it," said Fry. "So, having the opportunity to give them a chance to get healthy quicker feels really good and it feels like it's part of my responsibility to be able to do that." Vanessa is also on the Board of Directors for American Red Cross of Greater Idaho.

If you have recovered from COVID-19 and would like to donate your convalescent plasma, schedule an appointment by calling 1-800-RED CROSS or on their <u>website</u>. The American Red Cross says you need to be coronavirus symptom free for 28 days, or 14 days symptom free from a negative COVID-19 test.

IDAHO'S TRANSPORTATION INFRASTRUCTURE ARTICLE

Members of IPI's team that are working on the updated transportation infrastructure report published an article titled, "Idaho's Transportation System and Infrastructure are Vital to the State's Economy" in the June 2020 issue of Idahoroads Magazine. The article details some of the results of their collaborative project on transportation infrastructure in the state. The project addresses the following questions:

- 1. What is the state of transportation infrastructure in Idaho?
- 2. What has changed since the Governor's Task Force reported on the issue in 2011?
- 3. What policy alternatives are available to improve transportation infrastructure in Idaho?

The final report is due to be released this summer. The magazine is produced by the Idaho Association of Highway Districts and readers can download a copy on the <u>Idaho Association of Highway District's website</u>.
