
#### Annual Meeting February 6, 2018

#### Travel Corner Branson, Missouri

Branson, Missouri is located in the Ozark Mountains. It is known for its musical and stage attractions, but there are plenty of other places to see and visit in the area.

You can attend concerts and other types of performances from morning to night in Branson if you wish. Lodging and restaurant choices abound in the city and the surrounding area. The area is a great choice for a family vacation as there is something to appeal to everyone.

If you go, be sure to visit College of the Ozarks where no tuition is charged, all students work on campus, debt is openly discouraged, and no federal, state, or private loans are made. The Keeter Center Dining Room serves breakfast, lunch, and dinner Monday through Saturday and Sunday Brunch. There is also a bakery and creamery in the Center which are open for treats. The public is welcome.

At Branson Landing you can browse close to 100 shops and watch the Fountain show. There is also shopping available in Old Town Branson and at Branson outlet malls. There are also many museums and golf courses in the area.

The Branson Scenic Railway will take you on a 40 mile round trip through the Ozarks. You can also take an amphibious "Ride the Ducks" tour of downtown Branson and Lake Taneycomo on Ride the Ducks.

A visit to Branson is highly recommended for everyone's bucket list.
